
EAST GRANBY HISTORICAL SOCIETY MARCH 2019 NEWSLETTER

No, it's not gold in our hills, but copper ore and other minerals. East Granby lies astride a major geologic feature that has been subjected to mining from early days. Old New-Gate Prison and Copper Mine was chartered in 1705 as the first copper mine in the North American colonies and operated for 70 years (before becoming a prison). Tom Benedict, a lifelong rockhound, founding member of the Geological Society of CT. and member of the Bristol Gem & Mineral Club will show and tell about the copper and minerals mined and quarried from East Granby's "mountain" ridge.
